Students are required to undertake a practical internship of a minimum of 40 hours across a diverse range of psychology-related settings, including organisations, educational institutions, industries, or hospitals.

This invaluable firsthand experience bridges the gap between theoretical knowledge and real-world application, enabling students to develop crucial skills in observation, communication, ethical practice, and the application of psychological principles in practical and clinical settings through active engagement in field visits, data collection, and professional interactions.

Upon completion of these practices, students must prepare and submit a comprehensive case report, which they will present to their respective guides/supervisors. The formative assessment will be evaluated by the guide/supervisor, while the summative assessment, based on both the report and a viva voce examination, will be conducted by external examiners.


