The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement and the outcome achieved by the end of the year.

PLAN OF ACTION

- To request Tumkur University to hasten the process of recruitments to the vacant teaching and non-teaching posts.

- To add more books related to competitive exams like IAS, KAS, CA, ICWA, NET, SLET, CS etc. under UGC grants and the funds provided by the government of Karnataka and the Social Welfare Department.
- Top priority will be given to the academic interest of the students. Apart from teaching, the faculty will also strive to enhance competency among the students.
- Keeping in mind the need for job-oriented and need-based courses, we have decided to give training to students in communication and personality development.

- To organize special lectures, workshops and seminars to enhance the research and knowledge base of the faculty members as well as students.
- To have a fresh vision document, short term and long term goals, as per the vision of Tumkur University. Similar vision documents will be prepared by individual departments too.
- To subscribe more academic and research journals to the library and to add more relevant books.
- To motivate teachers to pursue PhD and MPhil degrees and to attend orientation and refresher courses.

OUTCOME ACHIEVED

- Necessary recruitments were made by Tumkur University thereby filling up the teaching and non-teaching staff.
- The college has prepared its fresh vision document including short term and long term goals. Individual departments too have prepared the documents, which will be presented during a workshop to organized by Tumkur University shortly.
- Several cultural and literary activities have been organized in order to encourage the latent talents among the students.
- The construction of an additional floor to the existing building is under progress, as per the plans of Tumkur University.
- Drainage system, pure drinking water, electricity supply have been improved.
- Beautification of the campus has been done with the participation of NSS and NCC volunteers and the Department of Fine Arts.
- Project proposals and conference proposals have been submitted to various funding agencies for financial assistance.
- Many of our faculty members have enrolled themselves for PhD degree.

• The library has got more books in all concerned subjects and also those related to competitive exams.
