National Seminar on Global Economic Recession: Its Impact on Indian Economy

He observed that negligence of the traditional family system by the western economies had been the major cause for global economic meltdown.

United States that went behind corporate life continued to neglect the institution of family, social and cultural values, which were very common to the Indian society. The decline in family system naturally led to the collapse of economic system, he analyzed. Further, he

added "Economics is nothing but an extension of Sociology, it is a part of Philosophy. Hence, there is no economy without society. But the US did not understand these intricacies."

Indian economy is completely different from that of American. A strong family system is the backbone of our economy. We honor social relationships, culture and values. Therefore India was successful in striking a balance when the entire developed world was crunching under the economic downfall, he pointed out.

Analyzing the causes for America's economic failures, the Charted Accountant said divorces became rampant in the US. About 67 pc of second time marriages and 75 pc of third time marriages ended up in divorces, while 20 pc of the youth follow 'living together' system. The entire process led to the growth of consumerism but never encouraged domestic savings, he noted.
