

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



1. PREAMBLE

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has stressed upon speedy and substantive academic and administrative reforms in higher education for promotion of quality and excellence. The action plan proposed by UGC outlines the need to consider and adopt Semester Scheme, Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), flexibility in curriculum development and examination reforms in terms of adopting Continuous Evaluation Pattern by reducing the weightage on the semester-end examination so that students enjoy a de-stressed learning environment. Further, UGC expects that institutions of higher learning draw a plan in time-bound manner to accomplish the above. The Tumkur University has implemented the regulations for P.G. programmes based on CBCS with effect from the Academic Year 2022-23.

2. TITLE

These Regulations shall be called the "**Regulations Governing Post-Graduate Degree Programmes**" offered by Tumkur University under Semester Scheme with Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), 2022-2023".

3. COMMENCEMENT

These Regulations shall come into force from the date of assent of the Chancellor of the University.

4. PROGRAMMES OFFERED


The programmes to be offered under different Faculties by the Departments of Studies and Research shall be as approved by the Academic Bodies and concerned authorities of the University from time to time.

5. DEFINITIONS

- 5.1. **Syndicate:** Syndicate of the University constituted as per Section 28(1) of the KSU Act-2000 for the management and maintenance of various affairs of the University.
- 5.2. **Academic Council:** Academic Council of the University constituted as per Section 30(1) of the KSU Act-2000 for the maintenance of academic standards of instruction, education and examination of the University.
- 5.3. **Blank Semester:** If a student fails to enrol for a semester or does not get required percentage of attendance, that particular semester shall be considered as a blank semester.
- 5.4. **Board of Studies (BOS):** Graduate/Post-Graduate Board of Studies constituted by the University as per Section 33 of the KSU Act-2000 in the discipline/subjects concerned.
- 5.5. **College:** Means any constituent college or college affiliated to Tumkur University.
- 5.6. **Course:** A paper specified by the concerned Board of Studies (BoS), and approved by the concerned faculty and then the Academic Council and Syndicate of the University for the purpose of teaching, learning, and evaluation during a particular semester.
- 5.7. **Credit:** A unit of study for a fixed duration. Every one-hour of lecture (L) Tutorial (T) per week per amounts to one credit; Two hour Session of practical/practice teaching/field work (P) per week amounts to one credit. Two hours of session/field work/ rural camp/ block placement in social


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work is equivalent to one credit (16 hours of Teaching per semester is one credit; 32 hours of practical/practice teaching/ field work/ rural camp/block placement per semester is equivalent one credit).

- 5.8. Degree: Means Post-Graduate (Master's) Degree offered by Tumkur University.
- 5.9. Faculty: Faculty of various disciplines (Arts, Science & Technology, Commerce & Management, and Education etc.,) constituted by the University as per Section 34 of the KSU Act-2000 and subsequent Acts consisting of such number of Department of Studies and Research as may be prescribed by the University.
- 5.10. Fee: Amount prescribed by the University for the Course/Programme from time to time.
- 5.11. Grade: An index of conversion of marks scored by each student after completing prescribed credits and relevant examination in each course.
- 5.12. Lateral Entry: Means the admission of a student who has passed four-year honours degree, directly into the third semester of four-semester post-graduate programme.
- 5.13. Programme: A level of education consisting of a set of courses leading to the award of post-graduate degree offered under Choice Based Credit System, for a specified duration.
- 5.14. Semester: Duration of four consecutive months with a minimum of 90 working days.
- 5.15. Student: One who is admitted to post-graduate degree programme offered by Tumkur University under these regulations.
- 5.16. University: Means Tumkur University.
- 5.17. Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs)- Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) are such online courses which are developed as per the pedagogy stated in the AICTE regulation notified time-to-time or equivalent; following the four-quadrant approach and made available on the SWAYAM platform of Government of India.

6. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION AND INTAKE

6.1. FACULTY OF ARTS

- 6.1.1 **M.A. in Economics:** Students who have secured an aggregate of 40% in all subjects and 45% in Economics in Bachelor of Arts (40% for SC/ST/Category-I) are eligible to apply for M.A. in Economics.
- 6.1.2 **M.A. in English:** Students who have secured an aggregate of 40% in all the subjects and minimum of 45% in optional English in Bachelor of Arts. (40% for SC/ST/Category-I)/Students with B.Sc., or B. Com, degrees are also

eligible to apply; provided they have secured 45% in English language at bachelor's degree (40% for SC/ST/Category-I) are eligible to apply for M.A. in English.

6.1.3 M.A. in History and Archaeology: Students who have secured an aggregate of 40% in all subjects and 45% in History or Archaeology in Bachelor of Arts (40% for SC/ST/Category-I) are eligible to apply for M.A. in History and Archaeology

6.1.4 M.A. in Journalism and Mass Communication: Students who have passed the three-year B.A. or any other bachelors' degree examination of Tumkur University or any other University considered as equivalent thereto are eligible for the programme provided, they have secured a minimum of 45% marks (40% for SC/ST/Category-I) in aggregate including languages and Group III subjects.

6.1.5 M.A. in Kannada: Students who have secured an aggregate of 40% in all the subjects and a minimum of 45% and in optional Kannada in Bachelor of Arts (40% for SC/ST/Category-I, or students with B.A., B.Sc., or B.Com., degrees who have secured 45% in Kannada language at the bachelor's degree (40% for SC/ST/Category-I) or students who have passed B.A., Integrated Course (5 years) in Kannada recognized by the University, or students who have passed Kannada Ratna course, or students who have passed B.A. honors degree, Kannada diploma passed after P.U.C. exam., Kannada pandith exam from Government of Karnataka, students who have passed Kannada Ratna Exam conducted by the Kannada Sahitya Parishad; students who have passed Vidhwath exam conducted by the Madras University) are eligible to apply for the programme.

6.1.6 M.A. in Political Science: Students who have secured an aggregate of 40% in all subjects and 45% in Political Science in Bachelor of Arts (40% for SC/ST/Category-I) or students who have studied Public Administration and secured at least 45% in Bachelor of Arts (40% for SC/ST/Category-I) or students who have studied Political Science as a subject in the first three years of integrated B.A.B.L/B.A.LL.B courses are eligible to apply for the programme.

6.1.7 M.A. in Public Administration: Students who have secured an aggregate of 40% in all subjects and 45% in Public Administration in Bachelor of Arts (40% for SC/ST/Category-I) or students who have secured an aggregate of 40% in all subjects and 45% in Political Science in Bachelor of Arts (40% for SC/ST/Category-I) or students who have studied Political Science as a Subject in the first three years of integrated B.A.B.L/B.A.LL.B courses or any other bachelors' degree with a minimum of 45% marks in aggregate are eligible to apply for the programme.

6.1.8 Master of Social Work (M.S.W): A Bachelor's or equivalent degree in any subject from a recognised University with a minimum of 45% in all subjects


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(40% for SC/ST/Category-I) are eligible to apply for the programme. 50 % of the seats are reserved for BSW graduates.

6.1.9 M.A. in Sociology: Students who have secured an aggregate of 40% in all the subjects and 45% in Sociology in Bachelor of Arts (40% for SC/ST/Category-I) are eligible to apply for the programme.

6.1.10 M.A. in Functional English: Students who have secured an aggregate of 40% in all the subjects and minimum of 45% in optional English in Bachelor of Arts (40% for SC/ST/Category-I) or students with B.Sc., or B.Com, degrees are also eligible to apply, provided they have secured 45% in English language at bachelor's degree (40% for SC/ST/Category-I)) are eligible to apply for the programme.

6.1.11 M.A. in International Relations: Students who have secured an aggregate of 40% in all subjects and 45% in International Relations in Bachelor of Arts (40% for SC/ST/Category-I) or students who have secured an aggregate of 40% in all subjects and 45% in Political Science in Bachelor of Arts (40% for SC/ST/Category-I) or students who have studied Political Science as a subject in the first three years of integrated B.A.B.L/B.A.LL.B courses are eligible to apply for the programme.

6.1.12 Master of Visual Arts (M.V.A.): Students who have passed the three years B.F.A./ B.V.A. degree examination of Tumkur University or any other university considered as equivalent thereto are eligible for the programme provided, they have secured a minimum of 45% (40% for SC/ST/Category-I) in aggregate.

6.1.13 M.A. in Hindi: Students with any bachelor degree with 45% (40% for SC/ST/Category-I) marks in Hindi, optional or language or who have passed any one of the following Hindi examinations with 45% marks (40% for SC/ST and Category-I) or Rashtrabhasha Praveena or Rashtrabhasha Visharada of Dakshina Bharatha Hindi Prachar Sabha, Madras, or Rajabhasha Vidwan or Rajabhasha Prakasha Examination of Mysore Riyasat Hindi Prachar Samithi, Bangalore, or Hindi Ratna Examination of Mysore Hindi Prachar Parishat, Bangalore, or Bhasha Praveen Examination of Karnataka Mahila Hindi Prachar Seva Samithi, Bangalore, or Visharad (with Hindi Sahitya) or Uttam (with Hindi Sahitya) examination of Hindi Sahitya Sammelan Prayag or Hindi Vidwan Examination of Govt. of Karnataka are eligible to apply for the programme.

6.1.14 M.A. in Sanskrit: Candidates who have secured an aggregate of 40% in all the subjects and a minimum of 45% and in optional Sanskrit at the bachelor's degree. (40% for SC/ST and Category-1) or candidates with B.A., B.Sc., B.Com, degrees also eligible to apply, provided they have secured 45% in Sanskrit language at the bachelor's degree. (40% for SC/ST and Category-1), or candidates who have passed Sanskritha Shahitya/Vidwat or Sanskritha Diploma or Pravesh Certificate of Surasarasvathi Sabha, Sringeri or Kovidha Certificate of Samskritha Bharathi, Bangalore, here with any bachelor's


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degree (Humanities/Commerce/Science) also eligible to apply for M.A. in Sanskrit.

6.1.15 M.A. in Education: Candidates who have completed their three year bachelor's degree with 45% (40% for SC/ST and Category-I) marks in Arts / Science / Commerce / Social work, B.Ed. (1 or 2 years); B.A. B.Ed.; B.Sc. B.Ed.; B.A. B.Ed (Integrated); B.Com. B.Ed (Integrated); B.Sc. B.Ed (Integrated). Out of which 50% of the seats shall be reserved for the candidates who have completed their B.Ed., (1 or 2 years); B.A B.Ed.; B.Sc B.Ed; B.A B.Ed (Integrated); B.Com B.Ed. (Integrated); B.Sc B.Ed. (Integrated) course and candidates who have studied Education as an optional subject for their three year degree programme are eligible to apply for the programme. In case of non-availability of such candidates, those seats will be allotted to the other candidates as per merit and reservation.

6.2 FACULTY OF SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY

6.2.1 M.Sc. in Biochemistry: Candidates who have studied Chemistry/Biochemistry as a cognate subject in bachelor's degree with an aggregate of 40% in all subjects and a minimum of 45% (40% for SC/ST and Category-I) cognate subject with two life science subjects are eligible to apply for the programme.

6.2.2 M.Sc. in Biotechnology: Candidates with bachelor's degree in Physical, Chemical, Biological, Agricultural, Veterinary, Fishery Sciences, Pharmacy, Engineering/ Technology, Horticulture, Dairy and Food Science from any University recognized by UGC/ICAR/AICTE/Medical Council with at least 45 % marks (40% for SC/ST and Category-I) in optional subjects put together from all the years of the examinations of the course are eligible to apply for the programme.

6.2.3 M.Sc. in Botany: Candidates who have studied Botany as a cognate subject in bachelor's degree with an aggregate of 40% in all subjects and a minimum of 45% (40% for SC/ST and Category-I) in Botany at bachelor's level along with two life science subjects are eligible to apply for the programme.

6.2.4 M.Sc. in Chemistry: Candidates who have studied Chemistry as a cognate subject in bachelors degree and Mathematics in Pre-University course or at 10+2 or candidates who have a bachelor's degree with an aggregate of 45% in Chemistry (40% for SC/ST and Category-I) as the cognate subject and a minimum of 40% in all the subjects or B.E./B.Tech. in related subjects/fields are eligible to apply for the programme.

6.2.5 M.C.A. (Master of Computer Applications): Admission to this programme is based on PG CET entrance examination conducted by KEA and unfilled seats are filled through MCA Entrance Test conducted by Tumkur University. Admission of the students to the programme shall be as per the University and Government of Karnataka rules notified from time to time. Candidates with any bachelor's degree with Computer Science/Computer Applications /Statistics/Mathematics/Commerce/Vocational Course in Computer


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Science/Business Studies/Business Mathematics with 50% marks (45% for SC/ST and Category-I of Karnataka candidates) are eligible to apply for the programme. Selection of students shall be on merit-cum-reservation on the basis of 50:50 weightage for marks in the entrance and qualifying examinations respectively.

6.2.6 M.Sc. in Computer Science /Computer Software / Information System / Software Technology: Candidates who have studied Computer Science/Computer Applications as a cognate subject in bachelor's degree and Mathematics in Pre-University course or at 10+2 or candidates who have a bachelor's degree with an aggregate of 45% in Computer Science (40% for SC/ST and Category-I) as the cognate subject and a minimum of 40% in all the subjects or B.E./B. Tech. in related subjects/fields are eligible to apply for the programme.

6.2.7 M. Sc Data Science: Eligibility for Admission to the Programme Candidates for admission to the first-year programme leading to the Degree of Master of Science in Data Science (M.Sc. – DS) will be required to possess: A pass in B.Sc. Computer Science or its equivalents / B.Sc. Data Science / B.Sc. Data Analytics / B.Sc. Mathematics or its equivalents / B.Sc. Statistics or its equivalents / B.Sc. Physics / B.Sc. Electronics / B.E. / B. Tech. / CSE / IT / ECE / EEE and E&I or its equivalents/ Bachelor of Vocational course in computer science or related.


6.2.8 M.Sc. in Electronic Media: Students with any bachelor's degree with a minimum of 45% aggregate (40% for SC/ST and Category-I) are eligible to apply for the programme.

6.2.9 M.Sc. in Environmental Science: Candidates who have passed a B.Sc degree in any branch of science of this University or any UGC recognized higher education institution with 45% aggregate in core/cognate subjects and SC/ST Category-I candidates with 40% aggregate in core/cognate subjects shall be eligible for admission to M.Sc. degree course in Environmental Science or students with bachelor of Science in Agriculture and other allied subjects (B.Sc Ag AgriMarketing, Agriculture Engineering, Agribiotechnology, B.FSc, B.Sc. Horti., B.Sc AgBiotech, B.Tech AgBio, Agri Eng, B.Tech Food Science, B.Fsc, BHSc, B.Tech Env Eng., B.E in Env. Eng., B.Tech) with 45% aggregate in core/cognate subjects and SC/ST/ Category-I candidates with 40% aggregate in core/cognate subjects from any UGC recognized higher education institution shall also be eligible to apply for M.Sc. degree programme in Environmental Science of Tumkur University.

6.2.10 M.Sc. in Library and Information Science: Candidates who have secured an aggregate of 45% in all the subjects (40% for SC/ST and Category-I) in any bachelor's degree are eligible to apply for the programme.

6.2.11 M.Sc. in Mathematics: Candidates who have studied Mathematics as a cognate subject in B.Sc. degree and Mathematics in Pre-University course or at 10+2, with an aggregate of 45% in Mathematics (40% for SC/ST and


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Category-I) as the cognate subject and a minimum of 40% in all the subjects in bachelor's degree are eligible to apply for the programme.

6.2.12 M.Sc. in Microbiology: Candidates who have passed a B.Sc. degree with Chemistry/Botany/Zoology/Biochemistry/Microbiology/Biotechnology/Bio science and other allied subjects as core/cognate subject with 50% aggregate for general students and 45% for SC/ST/OBC/Category-I students are eligible for M.Sc. in Microbiology. Additionally, candidates who have Bachelor's degree in Agriculture/Veterinary/Pharmacy/Horticulture/Dairy from any University recognized by UGC and other statutory bodies having Microbiology as one of the core/cognate subjects with 50% aggregate for general students and 45% for SC/ST/OBC/Category-I students are eligible for admission to M.Sc. in Microbiology.

6.2.13 M.Sc. in Physics: Candidates who have studied Physics and Mathematics as optional subjects in B.Sc. with an aggregate of 45% in the cognate subject and a minimum of 40% in all subjects are eligible to apply for the programme. In case of SC / ST and Category-I, a minimum aggregate of 40% in the cognate subject.

6.2.14 M.Sc. in Zoology: Candidates who have studied Zoology as a cognate subject in B.Sc. with an aggregate of 40% in all subjects and a minimum of 45% (40% for SC/ST and Category-I) in Zoology at B.Sc along with two life science subjects are eligible to apply for the programme.

6.2.15 M.Sc. in Psychology: Candidates who have passed the three years B.A/B.Sc. degree examinations of any university considered as equivalent thereto with Psychology as Major/Optional/Special subject are eligible for the programme provided they have secured a minimum of 45% (40% for SC/ST/Category-I) marks in the cognate subject.


6.2.16 M.Sc. in Organic Chemistry: Candidates who have secured 40% marks in aggregate and studied Chemistry (Cognate Subject) securing 45% marks in the subject at the B.Sc level (40% for SC/ST/ Category-I) are eligible to apply for the programme.

6.2.17 Master of Statistics: Candidates who have passed the BA/B.Sc./B.Com/BBM/BBA or any other equivalent degree examination with minimum of 45% of marks in the qualifying examinations are eligible to apply for the programme. SC/ST/ Category-I candidates must have minimum of 40% of marks in the qualifying examination.

6.2.18 M.Sc. in Food Science and Nutrition: Students who have passed a bachelors' degree with Food Science and Nutrition/ Chemistry/ Botany/ Zoology/ Biochemistry/ Microbiology and Biotechnology as core/cognate with 45 % for general students and 40 % for SC/ST & CAT-1 students in the subjects mentioned above are eligible for M.Sc. degree programme in Food Science and Nutrition.

6.3 FACULTY OF COMMERCE AND MANAGEMENT


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- 6.3.1. Master of Business Administration (M.B.A):** Centralised allotment of seats will be made by the Karnataka Examinations Authority, Bengaluru. Candidates with any recognized degree are eligible to apply for the programme.
- 6.3.2. M.B.A. in Business Analysis:** Graduates from a recognized university or professional holding BE, B.Sc.(CS), BCS, B.Sc.(IT), BCA, B.SC in Statistics., B.Sc. Mathematics and Students with other qualifications such as B.Com. BBM/BBA may apply provided they have done a basic mathematics/statistics at both 10+2 and Undergraduate level with 50% of Marks (45% marks aggregate in case of candidate backward class categories and persons with disability belonging to Karnataka state only) / Four years duration recognized by this university or who have passed any other examination recognized by this university as equivalent thereto by this University shall be eligible for admission to the Post-Graduate Programme in Management in (Business Analytics) provided they shall also satisfy the eligibility conditions like percentage of marks etc as may be prescribed by the University, Government of Karnataka, AICTE, UGC etc. from time to time .
- 6.3.3. M.B.A. (Training and Development):** Candidates with any recognized degree are eligible to apply for the programme with a minimum of 50% for General candidates and 45% for SC/ST and category-1 candidates are eligible to apply for the programme.
- 6.3.4. Master of Commerce (M. Com):** Candidates who have passed B.Com/B.B.M./B.B.A. or its equivalent degree examination with an aggregate of 45% marks in all subjects except languages are eligible to apply for the programme. However, students belonging to SC, ST and Category-I with an aggregate of 40% are also eligible (except languages) to apply for the programme.
- 6.3.5. Master of Commerce (Information Systems):** Candidates who have passed B. Com/B.B.M./B.B.A. or its equivalent degree examination with an aggregate of 45% marks in all subjects are eligible to apply for the programme. However, students belonging to SC, ST and Category-I with an aggregate of 40% are also eligible (except languages) to apply for the programme.
- 6.3.6. Master in Tourism and Travel Management (MTTM):** Candidates who have passed in any bachelor's degree or its equivalent degree in any subject with a minimum of 45% marks in all subjects except languages are eligible to apply for the programme. However, students belonging to SC, ST and Category-I with an aggregate of 40% are also eligible (except languages) to apply for the programme.

7. INTAKE

Intake for each programme shall be fixed by the Academic Council and the Syndicate on the recommendation of the Departmental Council/BOS concerned.

8. DURATION OF THE PROGRAMME AND ACADEMIC CALENDAR


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- 8.1. The duration of the PG (Master's) Degree Programme shall (normally) be Two Academic Years (Four Semesters).
- 8.2. The duration of the Master's Degree programme for student with four-year honours' degree shall be one year (Two Semesters) (Lateral Entry).
- 8.3. Each academic year will comprise of two semesters, and each semester will comprise of 18 weeks (with a minimum of 90 academic working days) excluding examination.
- 8.4. The University shall notify the academic calendar before the commencement of each academic year, indicating the days of instructions and study, examination and vacation.
- 8.5. For the award of Master's Degree, the student needs to complete four semesters of academic work and earn the minimum required credits. A student who gains lateral entry, needs to complete two semesters (Semester III and IV) of academic work and earn the minimum required credits.
- 8.6. A student can avail a maximum of double the duration specified for each programme to complete any Master's Degree programme (including blank semester/s, if any).
- 8.7. Whenever a student opts for a blank semester or fails to get minimum eligible percentage of attendance, and then intends to continue the studies, the student is supposed to study the prevailing course/s offered by any department.


9. COMPONENTS OF THE PROGRAMMES

Master's degree programmes consist of the following courses:

- 9.1. **Core Course (Mandatory):** Courses those are fundamental and compulsory in requirement for a subject of study in a particular programme with the content of required national and international level of knowledge. The core course prescribed for study in a programme shall not be replaced by studying any other course(s). A minimum of 50% of the courses of a programme shall be core courses.
- 9.2. **Dissertation / essential field work practical / term work / rural camp / block placement etc.,** leading to report writing and project/dissertation of the main programme of study shall be treated as a core course.
- 9.3. **Specialization Course/ Discipline Elective Core-** A Core course may be a Subject Core if there is a choice or an option for the candidate to choose from a broad category (grouping) of subjects (specializations / electives). These are the course/s which shall be chosen by the student from out of the various specializations offered by the department within the main discipline, in which a student intends to specialize.

A specialisation Course shall be offered with a minimum student strength of 10.


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9.4. Open Elective - Interdisciplinary Course/ Generic Elective Course: Course/s offered by any Department of Studies and Research other than the parent department in the University/College. Such courses are offered by the University to give an exposure to students about other discipline(s). It is mandatory for the students from a particular department to enrol themselves for the courses offered by some other departments as open elective inter/ intra disciplinary courses.

For any PG programme if open elective/ generic elective courses are not offered by other departments in the particular semester, then for that semester students who have to study OEC/GEC shall opt for a MOOC.

9.5. Elective Course- Elective course is a course which can be chosen from a list of courses electives are classified to Skill Enhancement Courses and Ability Enhancement Courses.

10. COURSES AND CREDITS

11. TITLES OF THE COURSES AND PREPARATION OF SYLLABI

11.1. The BoS of the post-graduate departments concerned shall decide the number, titles and syllabi of core and specialization courses for a given semester and for all the semesters, within the limits prescribed (minimum and maximum) for a type of programme.

11.2. The BoS of a PG subject / department concerned shall also decide the title and prepare the syllabus for the open elective course(s) offered by their department to the PG students of other departments of any faculty (inter disciplinary course).

11.3. The BoS shall prepare the syllabi clearly indicating the title of courses, nature or type of course (C/SP/OE), objectives, type of instructions (T/P/Tu/Project/Field work/Dissertation etc), medium of instruction, and hours of instructions per course based on the credits and workload assigned followed by expected outcome of the course.

11.4. The BoS shall follow unitisation of syllabus of each course (Theory/Practical/Fieldwork/ Dissertation), with a minimum of 4 units. Hours of instructions per topic of the unit be mentioned.

11.5. The BOS shall prepare the scheme of examination (internal / semester end), model question paper comprising of definitions, brief notes, short notes and descriptive type (Essays). The BoE shall ensure the coverage of all the units while preparing the question paper.


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12. COURSES TO BE OFFERED, STUDIED AND CREDITS TO BE EARNED

- 12.1 The BoS of the Subject / Department concerned shall offer the number of courses for a PG programme of 4 semesters based on the following limits.

Note: The number of courses for one year/2 semester's PG programme shall be half the number prescribed for a 2 year/4 semesters PG programme.

- 12.2 A PG student has to study the prescribed number of courses offered for programme and be examined and evaluated as per the regulations.
- 12.3 Besides these courses leading to a PG Degree, a PG student can also pursue career-oriented course / add-on course leading to the award of a Certificate / Diploma / Advance Diploma under Dual Degree - Certificate model. Apart from this, there shall be value added/add-on courses over and above the prescribed credits for a programme.
- 12.4 Credits to be earned: For the successful completion of a PG programme of 4 semesters, student shall earn the minimum number of 88 credits prescribed by BoS through the courses of Core/Specialization/Open Elective/Dissertation (Theory/ Practicals/ Fieldwork/ Project practicals). BoS in respective subjects shall decide whether practical course to be offered in open/generic elective course.
- 12.5 Credit Transfer for MOOCs: Learners are encouraged to opt for MOOCs (Massive Online Open Courses) through SWAYAM and NPTEL. Not more than 40% of the total credits shall be earned through the MOOCs. Not more than 40% of the credits per semester shall be earned through the MOOCs. Since MOOC is a guided self, study course 40 - 48 hours of work shall be equivalent to one Credit. The faculty shall oversee the progress of the learner as well as evaluate the learner for 48 marks / 2 credits. Students shall apply to the Chairperson / Coordinator other designated competent academic authority of the institute in advance and seeks permission for seeking credit transfer for the proposed MOOCs, he/she wishes to pursue. In case of SWAYAM, the students shall be evaluated as a part of the MOOC itself by the host institution (i.e. institution who has launched the MOOC through SWAYAM).

13. COURSE STRUCTURE BASED ON COURSE MATRIX OF CBCS FOR P.G. PROGRAMMES AS PER THE PROVISIONS OF REGULATIONS.

In order to bring uniformity within the faculty, the University proposes the following course structure and CBCS matrix for PG programmes offered under various faculties, depending upon the respective programme requirements,


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subject to the provisions of regulations. (The University may change the matrix of CBCS at a later stage based on feedback and due process of law and notification of an ordinance to that effect).

- For M.B.A. each domain (Area / branch) will offer Seventeen Core papers (68credits), Six Discipline Elective papers (24 credits) Two Skill Enhancement papers (Theory plus lab 02 credits in First and Second Semester (04 Credits) Two Skill Enhancement paper i.e Summer Internship project/ academic project 4 credits +Project 4 credits, (Total 08 credits), Two Ability Enhancement paper of 2 credits (First and Second Semester 04 credits), Two Generic Elective paper (8 credits), One Open Elective Paper (4 credits), Making up a total of 120 credits.
- At the end of Second Semester each M.B.A. student shall undertake a Summer Internship Project (SIP) for a minimum of 6 weeks. SIP shall have 4 credits. It is mandatory for the student to seek advance written approval from the faculty guide and the chairperson/ coordinator/ principal before commencing the SIP. The student may take up a SIP in his/her intended area of specialization or in any other functional area of Management. Each student shall maintain a SIP Progress Diary detailing the work carried out and the progress achieved on a daily basis. The student shall submit a written structured SIP report based on work done during this period. The student shall submit the SIP Progress Diary along with the SIP Report to the Department. Students shall also seek a formal evaluation of their SIP from the company guide. The formal evaluation by the company guide shall comment on the nature and quantum of work undertaken by the student, the effectiveness and overall professionalism. The SIP shall be evaluated for 100 marks i.e 70 marks for SIP report evaluation and 30 marks for viva-voce examination by external examiner. The viva-voce shall be conducted after the theory exam of third Semester. The learning outcomes of the SIP and utility of the SIP to the host organization must be specifically highlighted in the formal


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evaluation by the company guide. The SIP evaluation sheet duly signed and stamped by the industry guide shall be included in the final SIP report. The SIP report must reflect 6 weeks of work and justify the same.

3. Dissertation/ Project Work:
4. The BoS may offer electives A or B as specialization courses. The specialization electives may also be in groups. A student has to choose a particular group of specialisation papers in the beginning of the semester and shall continue to study the same selected group of electives in the subsequent semesters also. There shall be a minimum of 10 students for a particular specialization course.
5. The BoS shall finalise the titles for the respective courses clearly defining the course number, type of course, abbreviations of the type of the course, hours of instructions per week per course, credits, maximum marks (internal assessment and semester end examinations). The BoS shall ensure the framing of the syllabi for the respective courses as per the provisions of the regulations.

14. DECLARATION OF COURSES OPTED TO BE STUDIED BY THE STUDENTS

- 14.1. Every student has to officially declare the courses opted under CBCS.
- 14.2. Application forms for examination need to be filled based on the choices indicated in this card before submission of the same along with the prescribed examination fee.

15. SCHEME/METHOD OF INSTRUCTIONS

- 15.1. Each course shall have a specified pre-requisite syllabus approved by the BoS.
- 15.2. Students will be taught through the combination of lecture, readings, case study, group discussions, role playing, Management games, audio video lectures, and any other suitable for specific course.
- 15.3. Each course offered will have three components associated with the teaching-learning process viz., (i) Lecture (L), (ii) Tutorials (T), (iii) Practical/Practice Teaching (P), besides Dissertation/Project Work / Fieldwork / Rural Camp / Block Placement etc.

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- a. **Lecture:** An exposition/discourse of a given subject delivered before audience or a class, especially for instruction.
- b. **Tutorial or learner centric approaches:** A supplementary practice to any teaching-learning process that may consist of participatory discussion/self-study/desk work/seminar presentations by students and such other novel methods that help a student to absorb and assimilate more effectively the contents delivered in the lecture classes. Seminars, case study, discussion sessions etc., are part of tutorial or learner centric approaches.
- c. **Practical/Practice Teaching/ Field Work Practicum/Summer Internship Project/Industrial Visits/Field Visits:** Practical /Field Work / Assignment are part of contact hours for the faculty and must be considered in the workload. It is a method of imparting education that consists of hands-on experience/ laboratory experiments/ field studies / study tours etc., that equip students to acquire the required skill component.
- d. **Dissertation/Project work:** A Dissertation/Project work is a course with wider scope involving application of knowledge in solving/analysing/ exploring a real-life situation/ problem. Student in the fourth semester must take a discipline specific research project to understand the concepts of subject opted in specialization, and need to understand emerging trends. After successful completion of the project a student must submit the report to the department and have to undergo a Viva Voce before the panel of subject experts. The project shall be evaluated for 100 marks i.e., 70 marks for project report evaluation by internal and external examiners and viva-voce examination assessed by internal and external examiners for 30 marks.

16. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

- 16.1. The medium of instruction shall be English/Kannada except for P.G. courses in Indian and Foreign languages.
- 16.2. However, a student shall have an option to write the examination either in English or in Kannada. The medium of writing the examination for MBA and MCA programmes shall be as per the AICTE norms (English).
- 16.3. A student is supposed to declare the medium in which he/she writes in the examination, in the Examination Application Form.

17. TOTAL MARKS FOR EACH COURSE

- 17.1. Total marks for each course of 4 credits be 100 and of 2 credits be 50.
- 17.2. Semester-end examination for the courses shall be conducted by the University for 3 Hours duration and maximum marks of 70 for each Course.


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- 17.3. Internal assessment component will be for 30 % marks for Theory and 20% for Practical course. There will be no IA tests for Dissertation / Project Report. However, there will be 30% marks for viva voce examination.
- 17.4. Break-up for the semester end examination, internal assessment (component of continuous evaluation) shall be as follows:

Note: The Department shall decide the time table and nature (written tests/case study/seminar/viva-voce, assignments or any other means) of the internal assessment tests. There will be no IA for CPD and there will be viva voce in lieu of it.

18. ATTENDANCE

- 18.1. Each course (i.e., Theory paper or Practicals or any other type) will be taken as a unit for the purpose of calculating the attendance.
- 18.2. A student shall be considered to have put in the required attendance for the courses of a semester (i.e., theory paper or practicals), if one has attended not less than 75% of the number of the classes held for all the courses in every semester.
- 18.3. If a student who fails to satisfy the required attendance in a course (i.e., papers or practices or field work or dissertation) in any semester, he/she shall repeat the course when offered in the subsequent year. This facility can be availed only for TWO times in the entire programme.


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19. INSTRUCTIONS RELATING TO (A) INTERNAL ASSESSMENT (B) SEMESTER END PRACTICAL EXAMINATION AND (C) SEMESTER END THEORY EXAMINATIONS

There will be examination for internal assessment and semester end examination for each course as prescribed by the BoS. BoS shall prescribe components of and parameters for the award of internal assessment marks for the respective programme.

19.1. The internal assessment tests have to be conducted by the respective departments.

19.1.1. The first and second tests/ assignments shall be conducted/given by the respective faculty as per the time schedule.

19.1.2. The internal assessment marks of evaluated tests/assignments/case study be notified by the department and sent to the examination section before the commencement of theory examination. There will be no minimum marks prescribed for passing in IA.

19.1.3. In case a student has failed to attend the test/s, submit the assignment/case study and present the seminar as per schedule, it shall be deemed that the student has remained absent for the same.

19.1.4. All the documents relating to internal assessment shall be submitted by the faculty to the concerned chairperson of the department/co-ordinator of the programme/principals of the college before the closure of a semester.

19.1.5. The chairperson of the department /co-ordinator of the programme/principals in turn shall submit the consolidated statement of marks relating to internal assessment for all the courses offered by the department/college, to the chairman of the internal assessment co-ordination committee / Registrar (Evaluation) before the last date fixed for the same.

19.1.6. Internal Assessment Co-ordination Committee shall comprise of (i) Dean of the faculty (who shall act as the chairperson of the committee), (ii) Chairperson of the Board of Studies, and (iii) Chairperson/Coordinator of the department and a subject expert nominated by the Vice-Chancellor.

19.1.7. The Internal Assessment Co-ordination Committee for moderation shall be deemed to be effective if any Master's degree programme is offered by more than one institution. The respective Internal Assessment Co-ordination Committee shall formulate procedure for awarding of Internal Assessment marks. Any deviation from the formulated procedure shall be considered as erratic awarding of marks and such Internal Assessment marks shall be revised by the Internal Assessment Co-ordination Committee. The purpose is to moderate the discrepancies (if any) in the marks allotted to internal assessment components.

19.1.8. Internal assessment records are to be made available to the Internal Assessment Co-ordination Committee of the University for its Approval.


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19.1.9. The chairman of the committee shall forward the approved internal assessment marks to the Registrar (Evaluation) within one week from the date of closure of a semester in a sealed cover and acknowledgement be obtained.

19.1.10. Internal assessment records will not be accepted by the University after the stipulated time, and, no alteration of internal assessment marks will be entertained under any circumstances after the commencement of theory examination.

19.2. SEMESTER END PRACTICAL EXAMINATIONS (WHEREVER APPLICABLE AS PER COURSE MATRIX):

19.2.1. Duration of semester-end practical examination shall be specified by the University in consultation with the BoS.

19.2.2. There shall be two examiners – one internal and one external or both external or both internal, to conduct semester end practical examinations. The chairman of BoE may finalise the names of examiners. The examiners shall submit signed mark sheets and evaluated answer books in separate sealed covers to the BoE chairperson, to be forwarded to the Registrar (Evaluation) at the earliest.

19.2.3. All the records relating to the tests/assignments/seminars/case study etc., shall be maintained by the concerned departments/coordinators/principals at least for a period of 6 months from the date of announcement of examination results & made available to the University whenever required.

19.3. SEMESTER END THEORY EXAMINATIONS

The semester end examinations shall be conducted by the office of the Registrar (Evaluation).

20. SETTING OF QUESTION PAPERS

20.1. There shall be Board of Examiners for a programme / semester / course with internal and external members to set/ scrutiny the question papers for semester end examinations.


20.2. **Two sets** of question papers shall be set for each course for each examination. The BoE shall scrutinise the papers, verify the format *vis a vis* syllabi and regulation. The same shall be sent to Registrar (Evaluation) in sealed covers indicating all the necessary details.

20.3. For the subsequent examinations, the unused sets of questions papers already scrutinized by Board of Examiners may be used by the Registrar (Evaluation).

20.4. Clear instruction shall be given to the chairpersons of the BoE by the office of the Registrar (Evaluation) regarding the number of question papers to be set in each semester.


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- 20.5. In case of shortage of internal/external examiners, the chairman of the Board of Examiners (BoE) shall get the question papers set by external/internal examiners.
- 20.6. Board of Examiners shall scrutinize & approve the question papers and also finalise the list of eligible teachers for valuation from the panel of examiners approved by BoS.

21. Valuation

- 21.1. There shall be double valuation for all the theory examination, dissertation/project work.
- 21.2. The average of the marks awarded by the internal and external examiners shall be taken as the final marks for that particular course.
- 21.3. In case of difference in the marks awarded by the internal and external examiners for a course is by 20% or more, the script/report shall be referred to the third valuer.
- 21.4. The average of the nearest two out of three (marks awarded by three examiners) shall be considered for the final award of marks.
- 21.5. The practicals / project work / field work has to be evaluated by two examiners..

22. PROJECT REPORTS/DISSERTATION (SUBMISSION & EVALUATION)

(A) Submission:

- 22.1 The responsibility of allocating the topic for the dissertation/project, specifying the duration for the field work and methods, the time for submission of the same to the department etc., shall be decided by the Departmental Council.
- 22.2 The student, right from the initial stage of defining the problem, review of literature, progress of the work etc., is supposed to have regular discussions with the concerned supervisor/guide and submit the progress reports periodically.


(B) Evaluation of Dissertation/Project Reports

- 22.3 The student has to submit the dissertation/project report before the closure of a respective semester to facilitate the evaluation process.
- 22.4 The dissertation shall be evaluated by a panel of two examiners, of whom; one shall be an external examiner.
- 22.5 Total mark for dissertation is 100 Marks

- i. Of which, dissertation evaluation = 70 Marks and
- ii. Viva voce examination = 30 Marks


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22.6 For Dissertation/ Project Report (MCA), Internal Assessment component will be for 100 marks. 75 marks for viva-voce examination and 125 marks for Dissertation/ Project Report.

Total mark for Major Project/Dissertation for MCA Course is 300 Marks

- i) Internal Assessment = 100 Marks
- ii) Of which, dissertation evaluation = 125 Marks and
- iii) Viva voce examination = 75 Marks

22.7 Both examiners shall enter the marks for the dissertation evaluation in separate marks sheets (as done in theory examinations) and submit the same to the concerned in a sealed cover.

22.8 The viva-voce examination marks shall be awarded jointly by the examiners and the same should be submitted to the office of Registrar Evaluation in a sealed cover.

In case of science subjects, apart from submission of dissertation for 100 marks (70% for evaluation of dissertation + 30% for viva voce), there shall be practical examination in the form of presentation of summary of dissertation by the student for 50 marks (15 marks for internal assessment and 35 marks for Presentation i.e., 30% and 70% respectively). (**Except Mathematics/MCA**). The Internal assessment marks shall be awarded by the teacher (Guide) supervising the dissertation.

23 REPORTS/DISSERTATION (Submission & Evaluation and Marks Distribution) for MCA Course

23.1 The topic and title of the dissertation shall be chosen by the candidate in consultation with the guide and co-guide, if any. The dissertation work shall be carried out by each candidate independently during the fourth semester under the guidance of one of the faculty members of the Department. If the dissertation assignment is of inter- disciplinary nature, a co-guide shall be taken from the concerned other department.

23.2 The dissertation has to be carried out in the MCA department of Tumkur University /any Software firm/Public Sector/ industry or R&D institution or educational institution. The students shall be intimating details of guide and Co guide (if any) to the Chairman of the Department at the beginning of fourth semester. If a student carries out a project in any software firm or industry, they should submit the internship commencement letter as well as the internship completion letter to the department chairman. It is mandatory for students to take approval from the Chairman for the same.

23.3. The candidate shall submit two copies of the dissertation work to the Chairman. Duration of the dissertation work shall generally be 16 weeks. The candidates who fail to submit the dissertation work within the stipulated time have to submit the same at the time of next ensuing examination.


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23.4. Viva voce examination shall be conducted jointly by the internal and external examiners and marks shall be awarded jointly. The marks shall be sent to the University immediately after examination.

24. COMPLETION OF THE PROGRAMME

- 24.1. The P.G. programme under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) is fully a carry-over system from I to IV semester. A student can move from one semester to next semester irrespective of the results of the preceding semester.
- 24.2. A student is expected to successfully complete P.G. degree programme within the specified duration of a programme from the date of admission.
- 24.3. However, those students who fail to successfully complete the programme within the specified duration of the programme should complete it within double the duration of the specified period for a programme. [1 year programme (Lateral entry) within 2 years; and 2 years programme within 4 years].
- 24.4. Student may be permitted to take examination in odd-to-odd, and even-to-even semesters after paying the prescribed examination fee per course/semester, as notified by the office of the Registrar, Evaluation.
- 24.5. Whenever the syllabus is revised, the student reappearing shall be allowed for PG degree examinations as per the old syllabus.

25. DECLARATION OF RESULTS

- 25.1. Minimum for a passing in each course shall be 40% of the marks assigned for semester end examination as well as 40% of the total marks assigned to a given course of a semester (semester end examination marks + Internal Assessment marks).
- 25.2. There is no minimum for passing in IA component.
- 25.3. A student securing 40% of marks as stated above is declared to have passed a course.
- 25.4. A student failing in one or many courses may appear for the same during subsequent semester end examinations as and when offered by the University, within the stipulated duration for the completion of the programme.
- 25.5. The IA marks once awarded shall be final and are carried forward to subsequent examinations in case of repeaters or improvement of performance.
- 25.6. A student passing in all the prescribed courses of all the semesters of a PG programme is declared to have passed the said PG programme (Provided the student has earned the prescribed number of credits for that programme)
- 25.7. A successful student is entitled for improvement of the performance of all semesters or any of the semesters of a programme by surrendering the earlier


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performance of the said semester(s). Improvement of performance is allowed only for semester end examinations.

- 25.8. Students seeking improvement shall submit the application to the Registrar, Evaluation, for improvement, with prescribed fee, surrendering of marks sheet and specifying the number of course/semester for improvement. The student shall take the examinations of the said semesters as and when offered by the University, subject to total duration limitation specified for a programme. The provision to apply for improvement of the performance shall be available to a student only in respect of semester end examination and not for internal assessment tests.
- 25.9. Upon successful completion of a semester, the office of the Registrar Evaluation shall issue the marks card of concerned semester indicating the marks scored for the courses pass or fail remarks and semester grade point average.
- 25.10. The marks card of final semester shall also indicate the SGPA of all the earlier semesters, CGPA of entire programme and grade / class (only in case of successful students).
- 25.11. Upon successful completion of Master's Degree, a passing certificate indicating SGPA & CGPA as well as grade and class shall be issued.
- 25.12. Challenge Valuation: After declaration of the results of the post-graduate examination, a student who feels that his/her answer script has been valued unfairly can, after remitting a fee prescribed by the University from time to time shall request the Registrar (Evaluation) for a fresh valuation of his/her script. The Registrar (Evaluation) may ask a subject - expert from among the panel of examiners to evaluate the concerned script. The marks awarded in such a challenge-valuation shall be overriding the previously - announced one whether or not advantageous to the student. The Office of the Registrar (Evaluation) shall notify the fee for challenge valuation time to time after obtaining the approval of the Academic Council and the Syndicate. The procedure for challenge valuation shall be as mentioned Examination Manual of the University.

26. DECLARATION OF CLASS AND RANKS BASED ON PERCENTAGE OF MARKS AND GRADING

- 26.1. The class and grading shall be announced only after the successful completion of all the semesters (prescribed credits and courses).
- 26.2. The grading of successful students after the final examination shall be as per the table given.
- 26.3. Declaration of ranks: After the completion of time limit for declaration of results and report of appeals committee/malpractice prevention committee if any, the office of Registrar (Evaluation) may declare the rank list of students PG programme wise / subject wise, in case the student clears the examination in first attempt.


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- 26.4. The ranks shall be announced before the annual convocation and a minimum of 5 and maximum of 10 ranks shall be announced. Students who are repeaters or who are seeking improvement are not considered for the award of ranks. There can be a single or multiple sponsors for one gold medal.
- 26.5. The details of marks, CGPA, Grade and award of class and the overall interrelationship is given in the table.

27. CALCULATION OF GRADE POINTS, CREDIT POINTS, SGPA & CGPA

27.1. Grade Point (GP) is calculated for each course (paper / practical etc) as follows:
 $(\text{Marks Secured} \div \text{Maximum Marks}) \times 10$

27.2. Credit Point (CP) is calculated as follows:

$\text{GP of a Course} \times \text{Number of Credits for a given course.}$

27.3. Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) is calculated for each semester as follows:
 $\frac{\text{Total Credit Points Earned per semester}}{\text{Total Credits Earned per semester}}$


27.4. Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) for the whole programme is calculated as follows:

$\frac{\text{SGPA of all the semesters} \div \text{CPs of all semesters or number of semesters}}{\text{divided by total credits for the programme.}}$

27.5. Note:

1. SGPA is calculated only when the student clears all the courses of a semester.
2. CGPA is calculated only when the student is successful in all the semesters.
3. Only the credits earned for courses namely C, SP, OE, dissertation (T and P) shall be taken in to consideration for calculating SGPA and CGPA.
4. The Office of Registrar (Evaluation) may seek the advice of the Deans committee if there is any ambiguity in calculations of GP, SGPA and CGPA.
5. Successful Completion of the first year (first and second semester) of Msc in Library and Information Science shall be considered as equivalent


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to Bachelor of Library and Information Science (BLISc) and Successful completion of the second year (third and fourth semester) of MSc in Library and Information Science Shall be considered as equivalent to Master of Library and Information Science (MLISc).

28. REPEAL AND SAVINGS

- 28.1. Notwithstanding anything contained in this regulation of the CBCS system at Post Graduate level, the earlier existing regulation of PG programme is hereby repealed.
- 28.2. The provisions, of any Orders, Rules or Regulations in force shall be inapplicable to the extent of its inconsistency with these regulations.
- 28.3. The University in consultation with the Deans Committee/BoS shall issue such orders, instructions, procedures and prescribe such format as it may deem fit to implement the provisions of this regulations.
- 28.4. If any difficulties arise during implementation of regulation, the Vice-Chancellor /BoS shall be competent authority to issue necessary directions/clarifications/order for successful implementation of Choice Based Credit System. The same shall be brought to the notice of the Academic Council and Syndicate.
